

Recent Event Highlights

COPRI Event: Two Presentations



On Thursday, March 25, 2021, ASCE North Jersey Branch and the North Jersey Chapter of the Coasts, Oceans, Ports & Rivers Institute hosted a pair of presentations that earned 2 PDHs for the nearly 50 attendees. The first segment was entitled "Above and Underwater Inspection of Waterfront Structures", and was presented by Robert F. Garrity, PE, the Engineer Divers Group Leader, and Brian J. DeBaun, PE, the Engineer Divers Group New Jersey Leader of Jacobs Engineering.

The second segment was entitled "Rock Quality and Construction Quality Control for Rubblemound Structures", and was presented by Brent Sumner, PE, Senior Engineer with W.F. Baird & Associates Ltd.

GTG Event: Learning from Earthquakes

On Thursday, May 6, 2021, the Geotechnical Technical Group of ASCE North Jersey Branch presented a webinar entitled "Learning from Earthquakes: The Path to Resilient Geo-Designs". The presenter was Sissy Nikolaou, Ph.D., PE, D.GE, F.ASCE, the Earthquake Engineering Group Leader of the National Institute of Standards and Technology. Dr. Nikolaou discussed cases of successful and failed performance that involved site conditions, ground motions, topography, and soil-structure interaction. She also discussed how these examples can be used to more safely advance our designs. The event was approved for 1 PDH for the nearly 40 attendees, for which the certificate is forthcoming.



UESI Event: Preparation and Efficient Maintenance of Asset Register - Sewer

On Thursday, May 27, 2021, ASCE North Jersey Branch and the New Jersey Chapter of Utility Engineering & Surveying Institute (UESI) hosted a webinar entitled "Preparation and Efficient Maintenance of Asset Register – Sewer". The presenters were Jim O'Dowd, PE, of AECOM and Phil Martin, PE, of the Augusta County Service Authority. This was the second of two virtual presentations offered by UESI this year. The webinar provided a basic explanation of an asset register and how it can be used as the foundation of system understanding and management. With a myriad of



utility inspection and rehabilitation technologies and software available, it can be overwhelming to know where to start and to discern what would be valuable to incorporate and adopt. This webinar explained and categorized the various data sources, identifying the most important components recommended to be captured in the asset register and the appropriate technologies to be applied to maintaining it. The event was approved for 1 PDH, for which the certificate is forthcoming.

Recent Event Highlights

SEI Half-Day Virtual Seminar

On Thursday, April 15, 2021, ASCE North Jersey Branch and the North Jersey Chapter of the Structural Engineering Institute presented a Half-Day Spring Structural Seminar virtually. Nearly 30 attendees earned 3 PDHs for participating in this event, which included presentations on 3 different topics. The first segment was entitled "The Fore River Lift Bridge: How We Lift a Bridge" and was presented by Sean-Philip Bolduc, PE, a Senior Project Engineer of Infrastructure, at Parsons. The Fore River Lift Bridge is the centerpiece of the MassDOT Accelerated Bridge Program and seen as an industry-first in movable bridges. The Fore River Lift Bridge Project involved the replacement of the temporary lift span carrying Route 3A over the Weymouth Fore River in Quincy/ Weymouth, MA.



The second segment was entitled "Recent Progress in Testing, Simulating and Mitigating Corrosion in Reinforced Concrete Infrastructure", and was presented by Matthew Bandelt, Ph.D., PE, Assistant Professor and Associate Chair for Graduate Studies in the Department of Civil & Environmental Engineering at New Jersey Institute of Technology. This presentation explored new research on corrosion behavior in reinforced concrete infrastructure and discussed the techniques and new materials that can be used to limit corrosion-related durability challenges.

The third segment was entitled "Recent Advances in Wind Engineering for Tall Buildings' Structures" and was presented by Matthew Vallis, Ph.D., Associate Director at Windtech Consultants. The presentation provided an overview of the current best practice in wind engineering for tall buildings and the most advanced methods and techniques of analysis.

America's Infrastructure Scores a C-

The new national report card is out and America's Infrastructure Scores a C-. There is a water main break every two minutes, and an estimated 6 billion gallons of treated water are lost each day in the U.S., enough to fill over 9,000 swimming pools. Growing wear and tear on our nation's roads have left 43% of our public roadways in poor or mediocre condition, a number that has remained stagnant over the past several years. There are 30,000 miles of inventoried levees across the U.S., and an additional 10,000 miles of levees whose location and condition are unknown. 
