STEM Camp held for East Orange School Kids



The camp was free of charge and hosted 21 students at New Jersey Institute of Technology. The kids, in grades 6 to 10, learned many aspects of civil engineering, including airport planning, roadway design, and bridge design. The students created popsicle stick bridges and also tested their design strength, and even mixed their own concrete and later tested the strength of the mix design.

Chris was motivated to create this STEM camp program after seeing the Philadelphia ASCE group create their after-school civil engineering club. After years of planning, this camp came together this year because of Pennoni's contacts with the STEM Academy in East Orange and the flexibility of Chris's work hours to allow him to volunteer. The seminar included case studies and discussion of how Ethics relates to professional Standards of Care for design professionals and the roles that Standards of Care play in litigation for design professionals.

Technical Dinner Highlights

SEI Group Holds Site Tour and Presentation at Newark Airport: Terminal One Landside Infrastructure Project

The ASCE North Jersey Branch Structural Engineering Institute (SEI) organized a site tour and presentation of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey (PANYNJ) \$2.7 billion Newark Liberty International Airport (EWR) Terminal One Redevelopment, with a specific focus of all the Landside Infrastructure work. The event was held on October 25, 2019 in the Large General Manager's Conference Room at Building One, located at the airport.

Approximately 50 attendees gathered at Building One for this breakfast seminar, which was held from 9:00 to 10:30 am. Speakers from the PANYNJ included Mr. Richard Schnurr (Senior Program Manager), Mr. Leonardo Iacoviello

(Construction Engineer) and Mr. Paul Wong (Senior Structural Engineer). The presentation provided a program overview of all of the Terminal One work, including airside, landside, parking and the new terminal building; a more detailed presentation on the design elements and challenges of the landside infrastructure work; and a detailed presentation on the construction elements and challenges of the landside infrastructure work.

Following the presentation, the PANYNJ organized a bus to transport the attendees from Building One to

the job site where Landside Infrastructure work for the new Terminal One program was being performed. A guided site tour was conducted by the PANYNJ speakers from approximately 11 am to 12:30 pm including the multiple aspects of the Landside Infrastructure improvements: roadway, multiple bridges, utilities, permitting, MPT, ROW and access
